We have also applied for a Solar Panel Grant to help reduce our carbon footprint and reduce running costs.

More presenters have been getting the hang of self-production, utilising the resources of The Bob Osborne Studio (Practice Studio) to record and edit their own shows which is fantastic.

We expanded our Streaming Capabilities by adding our Station's Broadcasts to the CBAA App.

Some much-needed equipment replacement was made possible thanks to our successful grant Application. We have added several Imported Shows from presenters that produce their content from home. (A common theme since Covid Lockdowns)

Our On-Air Interviews are second-to-none thanks to our renowned interviewers, including

Dan, Dave, Bruce and Grace - even getting airplay on other stations they are so damn good. Finally, without the technical expertise of our Techno-Wizard Dan who has cobbled together some pretty amazing work-arounds for failing/malfunctioning equipment, would not be able to broadcast, so thank you again Dan for being the Heart and Brain that keeps the Goldfields FM Family from flatlining.

Membership Report:

Gordon read his report and thanked everyone for their Membership and support. The newly implemented 5-year membership cycle is working well.

Welcome to the 2023 and 17th annual general meeting of Goldfields FM.

It is hard to believe that we have now been on air for 17 years (since 2007).

Presenters, production people and general volunteers have come and gone over the years, but several of the original team responsible for the creation of Goldfields FM back in 2007 are still with us. Dan Leddin (the guru) has been involved since the start and I doubt whether we could survive without his expertise.

Although no longer a presenter or board member, Bruce Leech still plays an important role in maintaining and operating our very expensive transmitting equipment.

Al Comley has also been involved, as a presenter, board member and treasurer since the early days. A big thanks to Dan, Bruce and Al.

There has been a multitude of changes at Goldfields FM since 2007.

In 2011 we moved to our new home at the shire hub building after broadcasting in very cramped conditions at the MKM hall and I sincerely thank the Central Goldfields Shire Council for allowing us this space.

Several years back we built a new transmission tower on Centenary Hill which allowed our signal to travel further afield. (Bendigo, Ballarat and Daylesford included). Some people may remember the monstrosity beside the MKM hall in Burns St that we used as a transmitting tower in the early days. A real eyesore and not particularly effective.

Things continue to change and develop. We are currently in the process of installing solar panels at our transmission site to minimize our electricity costs and I thank Christine Richardson very much for securing a grant to finance this work. We also have two generators operating to ensure that 99.1 is never off air (one on Centenary Hill and one at the Hub).

So you can see that there has been a great deal of change here at Goldfields FM over the past 17 years.

In conclusion I would like to thank the board, all our presenters, our production team and our hub volunteers for the work they do. It really is a team effort producing quality radio 24 hours a day.

Finally, a huge thanks to all our valued listeners.

A down payment has been made and work has started on the project - Goldfields FM, Music powered by the Sun. Many thanks to ANZ Banking Corporation for their generous contribution.

Next comes fundraising and we thank the Maryborough Highland Society for their fundraising nights. There have been generous donations, particularly from the Lions Club of Maryborough, the Highland Society and individuals. We are grateful for the support.

Our membership fee covers more than one year and so our fee income consists of new members or re subscribed existing members as their term expires.

Many thanks to Alan Comley who did an amazing job as treasurer when I was away. Also to Dan Leddin and Ian Fettling who have taken the responsibility of the treasurer as I am usually in NSW at this time. In consequence of this I have resigned as treasurer and thank them for their generosity.

GRANTS REPORT 2022 -2023

Last August on behalf of Goldfields FM I applied for a grant to place Solar Panels at the transmission hut to lessen the burden of very high electricity bills to the station. The possibility had been discussed at Board meetings for some time and put on hold as the work had been deemed too expensive.

We were successful in getting a grant of \$13,581.00 from the ANZ Banking Corporation under the Foundation for Regional Renewal banner. This advice came late 2022. We hoped to have the panels installed by now, but have had to wait on the availability of the contractors to begin work there. It is quite a difficult site to reach and bring equipment to. However by the time of this meeting the work will have commenced and both the station and the environment will benefit.

Goldfields FM will keep listeners informed about the success of this project. Many thanks to FRRR and the ANZ bank for their generous grant and to everyone involved.

Production & Training Manager's Report

We have just completed another fantastic year of work by Goldfields FM's marvellous Production Team and have been able to continue broadcasting 24 hours a day. As a result of the pandemic many of our production team, and presenters, had to work from home and learned to record and produce shows. There has also been a growth in "syndicated shows". This has increased both the quality and quantity of material available to broadcast to complement live broadcasting.

We are indeed fortunate to have a terrific team involved in production. The team continues to work well together while striving to improve the quality of all production for Goldfields FM. The Production Team, now including many of our presenters, is continually refining processes to ensure the team is consistently producing the best possible product for broadcast, using the same processes and methods for production.

The use of two production studios has continued to make the recording and production of prerecorded shows and interviews even easier and has continued to dramatically improve the quality of the recordings. One production studio also has the capacity to record by telephone. It is also home to a training area, which duplicates an on air studio, including Jazler on a different computer. This is as a valuable training tool for presenters. During the year some new presenters have trained and taken the opportunity to present programs on air. We are always looking for new presenters, who of course receive high quality training. Why not join the on air team at Goldfields FM?

The songs database available for play on Jazler is now approaching 19,000 songs. Every effort is made to include a broad range of genre, so all types of music can be broadcast to our listening audience. This database continues to be supplemented by music played from CDs and USB sticks provided by individual presenters. There has been a particular emphasis on providing the latest music for younger listeners, so all age groups can be catered for by Goldfields FM.

Two local news bulletins are produced each week, as well as many interviews, sponsorship announcements, show and station promos and community announcements. Some of these are also used by other radio stations. The Production Team also processes a large number of pre-recorded shows which are provided by presenters who have their own recording facilities, or make use of ours. This also ensures the quality of all pre-recorded material before it goes to air. The Production Team also tries to keep the radio station's website up to date and relevant with many podcasts, and other information, uploaded almost every day.

This year some new presenters, including those who produce their own pre-recorded shows, have joined us. While this does increase the pressures on our recording facilities, it also means a wider range of high quality shows go to air. It also allows presenters who are not comfortable to present live shows to get their shows to air in a non threatening manner. Of course presenters can also produce their shows at a time that is convenient for them.

I am proud to be the leader of the Production Team at Goldfields FM and would like to congratulate and thank them all for their continuing efforts on behalf of your local community radio station. A special thank you to all our wonderful presenters, who provide a diverse range of music and other content for all our listeners out there in Goldfields FM listening land.
